Henley beach and Henley Square put on their Greek colours, on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> of January as the Greek Orthodox Community celebrated the Feast of the Holy Theophany, incorporating the Blessing of the Waters Festival.

Blues skies, crystal clear waters and those Hellenic culinary aromas at Henley Square, touched by the sea spray and kissed by the South Australian sun made the perfect community event, the first for 2023.

Minister for Multicultural Affairs and Minister for Tourism, the Hon Zoe Bettison, who represented the South Australian Premier Hon Peter Malinauskas at the official opening, said it was great the community celebrated together the Epiphany Day.

The lucky swimmer was presented with a gold cross by Archimandrite Mark Papan also receiving his blessings for a good and lucky year ahead.

The Community's newly elected President Mr Peter Gardiakos presented young Fotis with a trophy for his successful attempt and wished him best of luck and success for 2023.

Back onshore, cooking stations, grills and BBQs were on full swing, as a team of volunteers worked tirelessly to ensure demand was met.

Everyone's favourite 'souvlaki' (Greek skewers) and popular 'loukoumades' (honey puffs) were on high demand, with gueues forming outside the food stalls.

Culturally ready, the Festival featured dance groups from the Pontian Brotherhood of South Australia and the Community's own Dance Academy.

Live Greek music and dancing were also on the menu, with band 'Floga' playing popular dance hits, putting on a true 'panigiri' (Greek funfair) until early evening.
